Our speaker for this month is Alek Zaslawski from AWZ Orchids in Brazil. Perhaps some of you had an opportunity to hear his presentation to our society in 2020. This month he'll be presenting "Beautiful Brazilian Habitat" – specifically Cattleya granulosa, Cattleya guttata, Laelia praestens and Miltonia spectabile.



Alek was born and still lives in Vitoria, a coastal city and capital of Espírito Santo State. He was always surrounded by orchids in his parents' home but seeing orchids in the wild on trips with his father is what attracted him the most. He simply enjoys taking photos of orchids in the wild, however it is getting harder and harder in Brazil, as well as in other countries, to see them in their natural habitat.

Around 1990, his father retired and Alek quit his job as a mechanical engineer to start an orchid business with him. They noticed that most of the plants that were collected in the past simply disappeared from collections. Over the years, Alek and his father

have built a collection of about 20,000 plants from all over the world that now includes some of the best varieties found within many species, especially those belonging to the Cattleya alliance.

AWZ produces and cultivates their orchids in two nurseries in locations where one is in a cooler climate and the other in a warmer climate allowing them to grow almost any type of orchid. Combined, these two nurseries have about 62,000 square feet of greenhouses. #### ★ Orchidist's Word of the Month from the AOS

- ★ <u>Cattleyopsis</u> (kat-lee-OP-siss) A genus of eight species of dwarf epiphytes from the Antilles, especially Cuba, now considered to be synonymous with Broughtonia, it was described by Lemaire in 1853, the name indicating the resemblance of the flowers to those of the genus Cattleya.
